



SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION:

Scholarship Amount: \$5,000 - \$7,500

Deadline: September 1, 2018

The purpose of the Sonoma County Women in Law (“SCWiL”) scholarship is to assist a deserving law student with an interest in promoting women’s access to, and involvement in, the legal system by providing financial support to defray the cost of completing their legal education. The scholarship is open to applicants regardless of gender, and persons of all backgrounds are encouraged to apply. Applicants must have some tie to Sonoma County and preferably — although this is not a requirement — plan to practice in the area after graduating and passing the bar.

Qualifications: (1) ties to Sonoma County; (2) completion of a minimum of one year of law school; (3) a record of academic achievement; and (4) demonstrated commitment to increasing women’s access to legal services, and/or involvement in, the practice of law.

The essay may be typed or handwritten on this application; if handwritten, please write legibly. **Along with your essay, please submit:** (1) a resume detailing relevant work experience and any volunteer work with a particular focus on work related to the legal profession or to increasing women’s access to, or involvement in, the law; (2) a copy of your most recent law school transcript; and (3) a Student Aid Report (SAR) or the first two pages of your most recent IRS Form 1040; you may attach your parents’ most recent IRS Form 1040 if you are a dependent student.
